#### 2.1 Members

# 2.1.1 Tabled Question in the Name of Cllr P Johnston (additional item 08.05.25) - circulated

"Following the notice of motion on the 25<sup>th</sup>November 2024 regarding overgrown grass verges, paths and hedges, which received unanimous support for council officers to:

- utilise existing resources to GIS map the land in council ownership in order to:
- better understand responsibilities between statutory bodies in terms of ownership
- better engage with the public for reporting
- explore new models with other statutory agencies to ensure main arterial routes into our towns are better

maintained.

Will the Chief Executive provide an update to each of these actions?"

#### Answer:

At present, work on the Council's GIS system is progressing at a steady pace. Council currently have an extensive interactive mapping system constructed from the ground up, comprising of 50+ individual data layers ranging from accurate maps of the Council's estate to the location of our park benches.

The GIS Officer has established several DSAs with other statutory bodies such as the NIHE and NI Water, giving him access to their assets. The project in relation to grass cutting is one of several projects currently in progress but due to the extensive nature of the task and the current resourcing level (i.e. there is one GIS officer for the whole of Council) this will take time to complete in full.

Our GIS Officer is currently undertaking several projects for officers across Council in addition to grass cutting, examples are listed below:

- Council Climate Change Project
- Labour Market Survey Mapping
- MEA Tree Survey Project
- Legionella and Fire App
- Rights of Way Mapping
- AED Mapping
- City Deal Vacancy Project
- Carrickfergus Walls Project
- MEA Asset Database Updating
- MEA Leases & Licenses Updating
- MEA Waste Bin Mapping
- MEA War Memorial Mapping
- Plus, General Mapping Requests (Land Sales/Lease Maps etc.)

#### Additional note -

In relation to access to the GIS system as it presently stands, the system is security locked as it contains sensitive information such as names, legal documents etc. Our GIS Officer has previously proposed the idea of a GIS system that Elected Members and staff can access that holds the core data without the sensitive documents and information, etc.(A GIS System Basic) that would be added to the Council's SharePoint system, this would need SMT approval to proceed. I have already run this idea past the Legal Department and Policy both of which think this would be a good progression of the system. Although this Basic system, that would be available to Elected Members and Staff, would not contain 3<sup>rd</sup> Party datasets such as land boundaries of the NIHE/ NI Water etc. as this would be in breach of Council's DSAs with them.

If this update does not suffice it would be proposed to run a workshop for Elected Members, whereby our GIS Officer could provide a run through of the system, however, the GIS Officer has advised that a number of Members have seen how the GIS system works through subcommittees such as the Memorial sub committee.

# 7.1 Notice of Motion proposed by Cllr M Donnelly, seconded by Cllr M Armstrong (deferred from 31 March 2025)

"This council supports the spirit of Caleb's Cause NI, a grass roots movement started by Caleb's mother, Alma White, whose son is autistic and has learning disabilities. At its core, Caleb's Cause aims to close

the disparity in opportunities for young adults with disabilities accessing further education opportunities and to develop as individuals.

Caleb's Cause calls for the introduction of legislation to bring in post-19 Education Health (EHC) and Care Plans for these young people.

As a show of support this council will:

- 1. Pass this motion showing its support for Caleb's cause demonstrating the Council's commitment to improving post-19 provision for individuals with Special Educational Needs.
- 2. Write to the Minister for Economy, the Minister of Health and the Minister of Education urging them to consider introducing legislation to introduce post-19 Education Health and Care Plans and furthermore asks them to prioritise cross-departmental collaboration on planning and implementing any changes given the cross-cutting nature of this request."

## 7.2 Notice of Motion proposed by Cllr A Skinner, seconded by Cllr C Harwood

"Mid & East Antrim expresses concern at the unaffordable rents and inadequate protections for many of the 21,500 private renters in our borough.

We recognise that the significant imbalance between supply and demand for rental properties is driving up monthly rents and leaving many tenants struggling to make ends meet. We further recognise that too many private renters face unacceptable delays to access the basic repairs necessary to make their homes habitable and safe; and agrees to write to the Minister for Communities to call for:

- A review of minimum fitness standards in the private rented sector
- Statutory timeframes for private landlords to carry out essential repairs
- Measures to boost the supply of affordable rental properties, including a cap on short-term holiday lets and the creation of an Empty Homes Taskforce to help bring more empty homes back into use."
