Population

- Current population of M&EA (2014) is 136,642 [Ballymena circa. 30,000; Carrickfergus circa. 28,000; Larne circa. 19,000]
- Represents 7% of Northern Ireland population
- By 2034, M&EA is expected to have 140,520 residents
- This would represent an increase of 3%, slower than projected growth in NI (8%) and the UK (17%)

Businesses by sector

Largest 3 sectors

- Agriculture, Forestry & Fishing 1,350 businesses [30%]
- Construction 545 businesses [12%]
- Retail 390 businesses [9%]
- Compared to the UK, the area is over-represented in Agriculture, Forestry & Fishing (30% v 6%) but under-represented in the following sectors:
 - Information & Communication (2% v 8%)
 - Professional, Scientific & Technical (6% v 18%)
 - Business Administration & Support Services (3% v 8%)



Businesses by Size



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Micro 0 - 9 employees 90.2%

Small 10 - 49 employees 8.58%

Medium 50 - 249 employees 1%

Large 250+ employees 0.22%



Businesses by size

- 90% of businesses are micro businesses employing 0-9 people which is higher than NI (88.2%) and the UK (88.7%)
- There are only 10 large firms in M&EA employing more than 250 employees



Business starts

- In 2009, there were 245 new businesses created in M&EA. By 2014 this annual figure had increased by 18% to 290 new firms compared to:
 - 22% increase in new business starts in NI
 - 49% increase in new business starts in UK
- Both M&EA and NI have seen a lower increase than the UK

Employment by sector

- In 2013 there were 50,243 jobs in M&EA
- Largest employment sectors:
 - Manufacturing 10,408 jobs (21%) nearly double the % at NI level (11%)
 - Wholesale and retail trade 9,038 jobs (18%)
 - Health and social work 5,754 jobs (11%)



Unemployment - JSA Claimants

- Unemployment reached highest level in 2013 with 4,180 claimants reducing to 2,560 in 2015
- May 2016 2,200 claimants; but likely to increase following recent job losses at JTI Gallaher and Michelin

Qualifications & Skills

- 10% of MEA's working age population with no qualification, higher than the UK (9%) and less than NI (17%)
- 66% have below NVQ Level 4, which is higher than NI (53%) and UK (55%)
- 24% have an NVQ Level 4 or above, lower than NI (30%) and UK (36%)



GVA & Productivity

- Since 1990, GVA in M&EA has grown from £1.16bn to £2.00bn in 2013
- Over this period, average annual GVA growth has been faster in M&EA (2.4%) than NI (2.2%) & UK (2.0%)
- GVA per employee was £27.5k in M&EA in 1990 rising to £39.9k in 2013; higher than the average for NI (£39.0k)
- M&EA productivity has been higher than the NI average since 2010



Benchmarking productivity

- Highest levels of productivity in M&EA in 2013 are in the Energy sector (£216k GVA per employee) and Manufacturing sector (£46k per employee)
- Comparing sector-based productivity figures with the UK averages, the best performing jobs in M&EA are in the following sectors:
 - Energy (81% higher than the UK average)
 - Public Admin and Defence (22% higher)
- However there are many sectors where there is a 'productivity deficit' including:
 - Water and Waste (39% lower than the UK average)
 - Financial and Insurance Activities (35% lower than the UK average)
 - Information and Communication (23% lower than the UK average)
 - Manufacturing (17% lower than the UK average)



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Headline Future Projections

- GVA for M&EA is projected to increase from £2.00bn in 2013 to 2.77bn by 2030 at a slower rate than NI and UK
- Employment will increase marginally from 50,243 in 2013 to 50,700 by 2030
- Between 4,700 and 6,600 replacement jobs needed in M&EA following recent redundancies
- In 2030 GVA is projected to increase to £54.5k largely driven by productivity improvements in the future
